#### You Made this Possible!!! In Celebration of our 50th Anniversary: First Hope Scholarship Awarded to a Tutoring Program Student.

The Hope Scholarship was established this year in celebration of Anchorpoint Counseling Ministry's (ACM) 50th anniversary. It is made possible by the generous support of ACM donors like you and awarded to a tutoring student in our Youth Development Program for the pursuit of further studies after high school graduation.

For more than 15 years, the Youth Development Program has been an integral part of the services offered at Anchorpoint. During this time your support has enabled us to help over 1,000 students receive academic assistance and nurturing guidance from an exceptional group of volunteer tutors and paid teachers. Can you imagine the positive impact you have had on these children and their families?

Russell Paras, the recipient of the first ever Hope Scholarship, is one of these children.

According to Sandy Niekum, ACM's Tutoring Program Manager, "Russell truly deserved to re-



ceive the Anchorpoint Hope Scholarship. As a student in our tutoring program since 7th grade, he has demonstrated a strong work ethic, has shown tremendous academic growth, and has turned into a self-confident young man with clear posthigh school goals." Russell, a 12th grade student in the Shaler Area School District, will receive a \$1,000 award for the 2017-18 Academic year. He plans to enter CCAC's five year Associate of Science Apprenticeship Program to become a certified electrician.

"I can't believe I was chosen for this scholarship. If it wasn't for Sandy, the tutors, my parents, and most importantly, God, for placing me where I needed to



be, I would have never been shown that anything can be accomplished with hard work," says Paras.

The Award Letter was presented to Russell at ACM's Golden Anchor Gala & 50th Anniversary Celebration at the LeMont (more details about the Gala are inside). "My family is so grateful for the scholarship that was awarded to Russell. Thanks to Anchorpoint for this scholarship and for the affordable tutoring they provide so we can send all three of our children for tutoring lessons," says Nancy Paras, Russell's mother.

# Summer Tutoring Program

This program is designed to meet the unique challenges and needs of our students. One-on-one tutoring provides the opportunity for individualized instruction geared to student strengths and weaknesses. Customized lessons, taught by certified teachers, focus on the review & re-teaching of key concepts that the students need to master in order to be successful in the upcoming school year.



#### Subjects: KG to 12th Grade

READING – Sight Word Development, Phonics, Comprehension, Reading Fluency MATHEMATICS – General Math, Pre-Algebra, Algebra 1, Algebra 2, Geometry, Trigonometry, Calculus ENGLISH – Grammar & Composition \*Students may sign up for one or more subjects\*

#### **Flexible Summer Scheduling**

- Monday Friday, 9:00 3:00 (a few evening hours may also be offered)
- Schedule tutoring for 1 5 days/week
- Choose 1 hour, 11/2 hour, or 2 hour sessions
- Once scheduled, sessions will be the same days/times each week

#### Affordable Tutoring!

The cost for tutoring is determined by a sliding scale (based on a family's gross income and the number of people in the family). *Fees range from \$10.00/hour - \$25.00/hour.*
