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### THE CHILD AND PARENT PLACE AT ANCHORPOINT

#### A SOLUTION TO THE SILENT CRISIS FACING TODAY'S YOUTH AND FAMILIES

The harsh reality is that 80% of kids with an anxiety disorder are not receiving any type of treatment for it whatsoever. Studies have indicated that children who are suffering from depression and anxiety disorders are far more likely to struggle academically, socially and emotionally. Although these statistics may paint a dreary picture, there is no reason to give into despair.

There is still hope.

Anchorpoint is committed to tackling this issue, along with a plethora of other problems that are plaguing the youth in our community.

The answer is The Child & Parent Place at Anchorpoint (C.A.P.P.)

Led by counselors who are experts in child and family therapy and educational support, C.A.P.P will expand counseling and tutoring services for families across the Northern Greater Pittsburgh region.

The center is designed to strengthen Anchorpoint's ability to address the various needs of kids and families, including those struggling with depression and anxiety.

Rev. Dr. Ron Barnes, LSW, the Executive Director of Anchorpoint, is spearheading this project, because he believes it will address a growing demand within the community.

"The needs of our youth are just screaming out to us for help. There has been a sharp rise of anxiety and depression among kids," Barnes said. "There's no denying that there is a very real need for Anchorpoint to focus more on the youth. We are seeing all the pressure is on them."

Barnes' goals for C.A.P.P are focused on the whole family: "The whole emphasis behind it is working more closely with parents and educating them about their children's needs," Barnes said. "Children are hungry to learn and be nurtured mentally and spiritually and

I believe that C.A.P.P will offer them just that."

Mark Heinbockel, MSW, Anchorpoint's Director of Development, knows that the North Hills community is not excluded from this growing trend of anxiety and depression and will also benefit from expanded services through C.A.P.P.

"There's a crisis of anxiety and depression among our youth," Heinbockel said. "In our community I think a lot of these needs can be overlooked. We need to remember that there are pockets of poverty and deeper needs among our neighbors."

Jennifer Regester, LCSW is not only a family counselor, she is also Anchorpoint's Clinical Director. Regester will be overseeing the development of C.A.P.P with Barnes. Regester is excited and optimistic about the expanded positive impacts that C.A.P.P will have on struggling families and the community at large.

"My vision for C.A.P.P is that parents will be able to use it as a resource. No matter what needs you may have, we will be able to help you," Regester said. "I see it as a place that brings together more children and their families. It's going to be a place that will make these families feel safe and make them feel like they can communicate and grow."

Although it is a monumental undertaking, Anchorpoint's message is clear: they are not going to be intimidated by scary statistics. They see the situation as a chance to grow and expand their family support services.

"We want Anchorpoint to become the premiere "go-to" place for families in the North Hills that are looking for family counseling and tutoring," Heinbockel said. "Children and parents are our niche and we want to

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further solidify our place as experts in supporting children's needs while also supporting parents."

"I truly believe in the power of family therapy. Anxiety and depression can appear in so many different ways, especially in children," said Regester.

"The support you get with family counseling can really help. Just knowing you are not alone can make a world of difference."

According to Regester, C.A.P.P will be able to help families in countless ways because, ultimately, C.A.P.P encourages families to be together.

"It will be an opportunity for many more families to really connect and grow. At the end of the day, C.A.P.P will encourage families to spend more time together and bond."


